Shows on the Go

Shows on the Go (SOTG) provides self-contained, subsidised tours of professional performing arts productions to regional and remote Western Australia.

SOTG is a 100% community-driven model. That means **you** help decide which productions tour to your community. Each year two to four productions are selected to tour, based on community votes from the Touring Menu (see below).

The Touring Menu

The Touring Menu is used to inform the Shows on the Go touring program.

Producers from the country are invited to submit their production to the Touring Menu. It is then sent out to regional Western Australian communities who vote for the shows that they would most like to see in their town.

The Touring Menu also contains an Artists Directory which is a great year-round resource for sourcing artists for community festivals, workshops or arts projects.

STATE FUNDING

Community Arts Project Scheme (CAPS) UP TO \$5,000*

CAPS funding is a great place to start if you're new to community arts projects, or if your project just needs a bit of help to get up and going. You can use CAPS funding to help cover the cost of running a wide range of arts projects for your community in any artform, such as workshops, exhibitions and festivals.

**up to \$3,000 or up to \$5,000 for applicants above the 26th parallel.*

Annual Funding

The Annual Funding scheme is really unique. It gives community-based arts organisations something that is really hard to find through other funding bodies – core operational dollars. Applicants must be conducting a year long, multi-artform program that includes a broad cross section of their community.

YCulture Regional UP TO \$5,000*

YCulture Regional is a funding program for youth arts and culture and aims to deliver the Drug Aware message to young people in their communities. The program is designed to enable young people to develop arts projects that are planned by young people, for young people.

**up to \$3,000 or up to \$5,000 for applicants above the 26th parallel.*

REGIONAL ARTS FUND

Projects and Residencies

UP TO \$25,000*

Projects and Residencies funding is designed to support communities to work with professional artists to create innovative, high quality work in any artform, whilst developing partnerships and developing creative skills in the community.

**up to \$20,000 or up to \$25,000 for applicants above the 26th parallel*

Mentorship Program

UP TO \$30,000*

The Mentorship program aims to create partnerships between creative people to share knowledge and experience while developing new networks and skills. Up to two mentorships per year are offered – one to an emerging artist and one to a mid-career artist.

**up to \$25,000 or up to \$30,000 for applicants above the 26th parallel.*

Quick Response Grant

UP TO \$1,500

Quick Response Grants support small-scale arts development initiatives and professional development opportunities that need to be responded to quickly.
